Foundation Diploma in Traditional Arabic


Overview

The Foundation Diploma in Traditional Arabic is an educational program that has been created to provide students with a foundational understanding of the Arabic language. Arabic is not only the Quran and Sunnah's language but also one of the most widely spoken languages globally. This course aims to impart the essential skills of reading, writing, speaking, and comprehending Traditional Arabic, thereby creating a solid foundation for students to engage with the language and its community. Additionally, the program provides a pathway for further education.

Structure

The Foundation Diploma in Traditional Arabic is a one-year, part-time program that adheres to an academic calendar, commencing in September and ending in July. The program is divided into three terms: the first term from September to December, the second from January to Ramadan, and the third from post-Ramadan to July. Classes are conducted entirely online through our e-learning portal, to which students are granted access upon registration. Classes are held one day per week, with each class session lasting for three hours. In addition to the scheduled contact hours, students are expected to allocate a minimum of 2-4 hours per week to preparation and revision.





Assessments

The evaluation of student performance throughout the academic year is conducted through a combination of formative and summative assessments. Formative assessments, such as in-class questions and quizzes, are used to assess student understanding and progress on a regular basis. These assessments allow for timely feedback and adjustments to instruction to ensure that students are keeping pace with the material being covered. Additionally, summative assessments are conducted at the end of the program in the form of optional exams. These exams serve as a comprehensive evaluation of student mastery of the material covered during the term and provide a final evaluation of student performance for that term. The results of these assessments are used to determine students' final grades and provide feedback to students on areas where they may need to improve or where they have excelled. This approach to assessment allows for the monitoring of student progress throughout the academic year and ensures that students are meeting the program's learning objectives.

Entry Requirements

The requirements for entry into the program are:

- Fluency in written and spoken English
- All applicants must be over 12 years of age
- Applicants are expected to be intellectually curious, hardworking, and committed to the aims of the College.
